THEME

Aavidum Role Models

LEARNING OUTCOMES

At the end of the lesson, the students are expected to:

- Identify the values that Aavidum promotes, like kindness, acceptance, and support.
- Reflect on how they show those values in their words and actions.
- Make a personal pledge to be a positive role model in their school.

MATERIALS

- Aavidum Ambassador Badge templates
- Markers, crayons, colored pencils
- Scissors
- Yarn, lanyards, or safety pins to wear the badges
- Optional: hole punch

ESSENTIAL QUESTIONS

- How can I be a role model of kindness and support in my school?

CHECK-IN / WELCOME (5 MINUTES)

Say: "Today we're going to talk about something very important: being a role model. A role model is someone others look up to because of the way they act and treat people. You don't need to be famous to be a role model. In fact, the best role models are right here in our own school."

Ask: "What do you think makes someone a great role model?"
Let a few students share.

Say: "At Aavidum, we try to be kind, accepting, and supportive. Today, we'll think about how we can each be role models of those values for others, especially younger students who look up to you."

GUIDED DISCUSSION/TOPIC INTRODUCTION (7 MINUTES)

Say: "Let's imagine that each of you has been chosen to be an Aavidum Ambassador, someone who represents the spirit of Aavidum in our school. What kind of actions do you think an Aavidum Ambassador would take each day?"

Prompt students with questions like:

- What would an Aavidum Ambassador say to someone who feels left out?
- How could an Aavidum Ambassador show respect to classmates and teachers?
- How would an Aavidum Ambassador handle conflict or a disagreement?

ACTIVITY: AMBASSADOR BADGES (20 MINUTES)

Say: "Now it's your turn to create your very own Aavidum Ambassador Badge. Your badge will show:

- Three values you want to represent like kindness, courage, empathy, or responsibility
- A short personal pledge that says how you'll show those values through your actions

ACTIVITY (CONTINUED)

Examples to model on the board:

- Pledge: "I will smile at people who look like they need a friend."
- Pledge: "I will listen to others even when I don't agree."

Instructions:

- Choose your values and write them on your badge.
- Decorate your badge with symbols, colors, or designs that represent you as an ambassador.
- Write your personal pledge in the space provided.
- Punch a hole at the top and thread yarn through so you can wear it.

Distribute materials. Circulate and assist students as needed.

WRAP-UP (5 MINUTES)

Say: "Let's celebrate the awesome values you all chose. Would anyone like to share their badge and personal pledge with the class?"

Invite volunteers to share their values and pledge.

Consider holding a gallery walk so that students can see each others' badges.

Ask:

- "How can these badges help us remember to be role models every day?"

Say: "Being an Aavidum Ambassador doesn't mean you have to be perfect. It just means you try your best every day to make others feel seen, heard, and cared for. Even small actions like saying 'hi' to someone or helping a classmate can make a big difference."

Ask:

- "Raise your hand if you're proud of the value you chose today."
- "Raise your hand if you think you can live out your pledge this week."
